


This booklet has been prepared to help you and hopefully answer any questions which you might have before you start in September.

White shirt	Plain white shirt (long or short sleeved) that is suitable for tucking into skirts or trousers.	Anywhere
School tie	Years 7-11 wear the same black, gold and teal tie but the sixth form have a distinctive one supplied by the school when they enter the sixth form.	Local uniform retailers
	Plain black tailored trousers. Leggings, jeans or skin tight trousers are not permitted.	
Black trousers or skirt	Plain black tailored skirt. Straight, pleated or swing skirts are acceptable as long as they are tailored and hemmed properly; no dipped or uneven hems, chiffon or unusual material or decorations.	Anywhere
	Skirts should not be too tight or short. The skirt should be approximately knee length. Skirts should always be worn with black opaque tights.

Black school shoes	Plain black, low heeled shoes. Trainers/sports shoes are not permitted at any time of the year.	Anywhere
Black socks or opaque tights	Socks and tights should be black. Tights should be opaque and a least 80 denier.	Anywhere
Coat	A smart, practical all weather coat that can be worn over uniform. Hooded, fleece style tops, obvious logos, denim or leather coats are not permitted.	Anywhere

DISTINCTIVE CLOTHING AWARDS

The school, through the local Education Department, makes allowances to some pupils attending school, subject to eligibility by assessment, towards the cost of distinctive school clothing.

Parents seeking further advice on this matter may contact the school.

HAIR AND GENERAL APPEARANCE

Parents are expected to encourage pupils to observe acceptable standards in dress and appearance. Hair should be a sensible length, style and colour (no unnatural hair colouring is allowed). Vision must not be impeded by hair. Make-up must not be worn in school, and neither should hair cosmetics be used, especially in the Science Laboratories and Technology Workshops.

JEWELLERY

The only jewellery which may be worn in school is one small plain stud in the lobe of each ear. Pupils are <u>not</u> allowed to wear any other form of body jewellery in the interests of their own health and safety.

VALUABLES

It should be clearly understood that all items of personal property are brought on to the school premises at the owner's risk. The school cannot be held responsible for any losses incurred and no claims for reimbursement for any losses sustained will be entertained.

MOBILE PHONES

It is strongly recommended that mobile phones be left at home. The school cannot accept responsibility for the loss or damage to such equipment.










Suitable examples of shorts and skirts

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS



Here are answers to some of the questions that you might have about joining Bryntirion in September.

What do I bring on the first day?

You will need a bag, pencils, pens, rubber, sharpener and ruler. You will also need sandwiches or dinner money loaded onto the cashless catering system.

Do I need any books?

No, you will not need any books. Your subject teacher will give you the books that you need.

What happens if I lose my things or forget my dinner money?

Go to your Head of Year and they will help you.

Will I be in the same class as my friends?

You might not be in the same class as all your friends, but you will certainly be with some of your friends.

What if I get lost?

Any teacher or older pupil that passes you will be pleased to help. There is also a map in this booklet.

What if I have to leave school for an appointment?

Ask your mum/dad/guardian to write a note for you. Show it to your Form Tutor and you will receive an <u>exeat form</u>, to be signed by your Head of Year. You then hand in this form to the school office (downstairs in E block) on leaving.

What if I feel ill during school?

If this happens during lesson time, tell the teacher who is taking your lesson and they will call for a duty officer. If this happens during break or lunch go to see your Head of Year.

What if I am unhappy in school?

Speak to your Form Teacher or your Head of Year who will be happy to help you.

What do I do if I am absent?

- Ask someone at home to let us know on the <u>FIRST</u> day
- It is very important that you copy up all the work that you have missed as soon as possible.



SCHOOL MEALS



DINNER LADIES

Our school has many helpful and friendly dinner ladies who work during the lunch break.

THE FOOD

Lunchtime, the canteen offers three types of meals:-

- Main Track (main meals)
- Fast Track (fast food)
- Green Track (salads sandwiches etc)





The prices are reasonable. We use a cashless catering system which your parent/ guardian will be invited to join before you start.

Alternatively, you can bring your own packed lunch.

This can be eaten outside or in the canteen.

BREAKFAST BAR

In addition to lunch, there is a breakfast bar at break time. This offers a variety of snacks. These bars are in D and E block canteens.





SUBJECTS

ART & DESIGN

This is a subject that provides pupils with a variety of experiences in using different materials to produce pieces of art work.



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ENGLISH

You will read all kinds of stories, poems, plays and media articles. As well as this, you will develop your own skills as a young writer. You will have the chance to debate, recite and take part in school plays.

FRENCH

In the course of the year, pupils in Year 7 will learn about France and the French speaking world. You will engage in small playlets and conversations in French about yourselves, your families and friends.





GEOGRAPHY

An introduction to the world, its environment and the way man has made an impact are just some of the topics covered in this subject.



This course aims to promote an understanding of the nature of change in history. Pupils are encouraged to act like detectives and use clues to build up a picture of the past. They progress to evaluate evidence and acquire historical skills.





I.T.

In this subject, you will learn new I.T. skills and develop ones that you already have. You will learn about databases, spreadsheets, desktop publishing as well as using the Internet. Lessons are interactive using a wide range of packages, introducing you to skills which will benefit you in other subjects and eventually the world of work.

MATHEMATICS

In this subject you will learn many new mathematical skills and develop ones you already have. As well as this, you will be taught to investigate and use I.T. to aid your understanding of mathematics. It will be hard work, but it will all add up to great fun!



MUSIC

In Music you will learn to play and sing a variety of music. You will also learn to compose and you will listen to and discuss a variety of musical styles. There may be an opportunity to learn a new instrument, to sing in the school choir and to take part in the school show.
