Part/Role	Costume ideas/suggestions
Narrators	Christmas jumper and a skirt or jeans/trousers unless they have a part such as an angel.
Presenters at the beginning and end	
Pupils without a speaking part	
Roman Soldier	Roman soldier outfits or a white tunic with a red cape
Town Officials	Trousers/Skirt and shirt/blouse
Innkeepers Visitors	Traditional townspeople outfit or long tunic with a belt and an apron.

Shepherds and Joseph	Traditional biblical/nativity costumes e.g. long robes, cloaks, shawls, headdress with tea towels, sandals etc. Shepherds may have crooks / cuddly sheep
Mary	Mary to dress in blue robes.
Three Kings	Traditional nativity costumes e.g. long, luxurious robes/cloaks, jewels, crowns, sandals.
Donkey	Donkey mask, grey clothes e.g jumper, jogging bottoms/trousers, tights/leggings, tail attached e.g. stuffed grey tights
Angel Gabriel and Angels	Traditional angel costumes – white/gold/silver/sparkly fabric, wings, halos, tinsel
